Pump Packing Installation Guidelines





FOLLOW ALL PLANT SAFETY AND OPERATING GUIDELINES!

- 1. Remove all the old packing and the lantern ring.
- 2. Clean the stuffing box and shaft thoroughly.
- 3. Examine the shaft and stuffing box for wear and erosion/corrosion.
- 4. Replace the shaft if excessive wear is present.
- 5. Check for shaft runout if possible. Correct as required.
- 6. Cut packing rings to the proper size required for the equipment.
- 7. Place the first ring around the shaft and into the stuffing box, use a packing tamper to install the ring until properly seated all the way in the bottom of the stuffing box.
- 8. Install the remaining rings and the lantern ring, <u>ONE AT A TIME</u>, stagger the joints until each ring is seated properly. Make sure the lantern ring is aligned under the fresh water inlet.
- 9. Draw the gland follower up and tighten the nuts finger tight.
- 10. Turn the shaft by hand or jog with the motor, to unbind the packing.

FOR A FLUSHED PUMP: Flood the pump and start. Tighten nuts one flat at a time to get controlled leakage desired.

FOR FLUSH FREE SERVICE: (Only applies when installing NEBCO Styles 7800, 702 & 728 AKII*.) Install the first two rings and compress tightly with a tamper, install the remaining rings (without a lantern ring) one at a time. Turn the gland follower two extra flats. Start the pump. If leakage occurs tighten until it stops. Steam and smoke will usually occur at the box for a short period of time. Allow packing to "settle in". Do not back off the gland follower!

Note: New packing will run a little warmer for the first few hours until the packing has seated itself.

DO NOT OVERTIGHTEN THE GLAND NUTS AS THIS MAY DAMAGE THE PACKING AND/OR THE SHAFT!

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
